- National rules for mortgages were meant to cool down Vancouver and Toronto markets
- Mortgage "stress tests" are hurting first-time buyers in Calgary

Ensure producers cover the cost to recycle their paper & packaging waste

Calgarians pay twice for recycling:

For recycling costs already built into national product prices





Could potentially save Calgarians up to \$30M/yr in Blue Cart costs

- Need legislation to shift recycling responsibility to producers – called Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR)
- All other provinces have EPR in place or underway
